It is a privilege to offer a glimpse into the myriad initiatives that keep The Orbis School, Keshav Nagar, dynamic throughout the year as we present the school's annual report.

Like any other year, this year too, our class 12 students made us very proud with a 100% pass result. Out of the batch, 36% of the students scored more than 90%, and 51% of the students passed with distinction.

Our Science toppers were Priyenka Anand with 95.2%, followed by Vidit Galatagi with 94.6% and Dev Chanakyas scoring 94.4%.

Adweta Kar topped the Commerce batch with 97.2%, and both Jayanthi Krithika and Riddhima Neekhra were in the second position with 96%. While Naincy Jha was in the third position with 94.8%

We are extremely proud of the Humanities stream topper, District topper with Gayathri Devi Jayachandran, our Student of the Year 2024-25. She has not only topped The Orbis School in her respective field but has also outshone, with a 98.6%, Chetna Sinha with 95.8%, and both Mrigakshi Dutta and Shanvi Anoop Gupta trailed closely with 94.4%.

We are elated that our class 10 batch passed with flying colors with 47% of the students scoring above 90% and 45% scoring above 75%. Lakshita Pattnaik brought laurels to herself and the school with a score of 99.4%. Aanya Bagui and Snigdha Ranjit Jadhav placed second with 99.2%, followed by Sachchit Shankaran, Shaurya Singh, Shrestha Sharma, and T Ishana, all tied for the third position with 98.8%. These achievements are a testimony to the hard work and dedication of our students, teachers and parents. We extend our heartfelt congratulations to them for their outstanding performance.

Additionally, for Pre-Primary to Class 2, the introduction of the Holistic Report Card marked a significant step towards comprehensive and child-centric assessment in alignment with the NEP initiative.

This diverse participation not only provided a platform for students to express their abilities but also enriched their overall learning experience, fostering a spirit of competition and collaboration in various domains.

Overall, the students of the Orbis School are making the most of their opportunities and excelling in various fields.

The NCC program has flourished, and a new cohort of students has been enrolled. In addition, the graduating batch has demonstrated outstanding performance and excellence in their examinations. They successfully attended a 10-day camp held at the NCC Pune Headquarters of the 3rd Maha Air Squadron.

During the NCC session 2025-26, cadets of 3 MAH Air Squadron NCC, Pune, achieved significant milestones in academics, training, sports, and co-curricular

activities. Cadets participated in the Army Day Mela and Army Day Parade, Republic Day and Independence Day Parades, NCC Day Celebration, Sports Day Parade, Air Force Day Celebration, and Republic Day Parade 2026, demonstrating high standards of discipline and ceremonial excellence. A new batch of 28 cadets was successfully enrolled, increasing unit strength to 50.

Participation in CATC-710 provided exposure to Garud Commandos, Sukhoi-30 fighter aircraft, aero-modelling, and .22 rifle firing, significantly enhancing training outcomes. In football, students from classes 8 to 12 participated in Subroto Under-14, 17 boys & girls competitions, under-19 age group football, and DSO competitions held in Pune.

Our school aims to build a strong character in young minds through its programs and activities. Values like truth, honesty, and empathy are taught to students to guide their decision-making.

The Interact club students actively participated in environmental conservation through various activities conducted throughout the year. These activities were:

- Conducted an awareness session in accordance with Label Padhega India for the students of class 4 to sensitise them and make them aware of what they are consuming.
- Conducted a painting competition and a plantation drive at RSM school, thereby spreading awareness to their classmates about the conservation of the environment.
- Visited Shri Muk Badhir Vidyalaya, Wagholi, to spread the joy of giving and spend their time with the deaf and mute students. They spread their warmth by donating blankets to these children.
- Collected clothes to donate to the NGO who upcycle the clothes and sell them to generate income.

As they say, "no one can help everyone, but everyone can help someone" Just like past years, this year too, we at the Orbis school continued our endeavours wholeheartedly in many social service projects.

- Cancer Patient Aid Association is one of the largest NGOs in India who meet the needs of the underprivileged Cancer patients.
- The Orbis School has been associated with the organisation, and the students and staff collect old newspapers to raise funds for Cancer patients. This year too, our students collected approximately 950 kilos of newspapers, wholesome contributions of hand towels, soaps (bathing and detergent), toothpaste, skin care creams and coconut oil.
- Rs. 15,000 were collected for the Indian Association of the Blind (White Cane)
- The Scouts and Guides students, along with the teachers of the Upper Primary Wing, actively participated in the "Together We Can Make a Difference" initiative. With great compassion and social responsibility, they donated approximately 115 kg of rice, 118 kg of wheat flour, and 76 kg of sugar to the Deaf and Mute children at the BVJSS Orphanage, Wagholi, spreading hope, kindness, and the true spirit of giving.
- The Society for the Welfare of the Differently Abled Person, Education and Research Centre (SWPH) (RC) is the first institution to be set up to rehabilitate orthopedically handicapped children. This year, a collection of Rs 35000/- (Rs. 17,000 from Enterprise) has been achieved.
- Janwani, a public charitable trust established by the Mahratta Chamber of Commerce, Industries, and Agriculture (MCCIA), Pune, works towards making Pune a more livable city through year-round awareness and collection drives across schools, colleges, housing societies, and commercial establishments. The Orbis School actively contributed to this initiative by participating in the e-waste and plastic waste collection drive, supporting the larger cause of environmental sustainability.
- The Enterprise Club has been at its best this year, conducting various events and promoting an entrepreneurial mindset among the students. The students of the Enterprise Club showcased exceptional coordination during Friendship Day Celebrations and the Children's Celebrations, demonstrating teamwork, innovation, and organisational prowess. Their collaborative efforts elevated the events, fostering a vibrant atmosphere that seamlessly blended academia with industry insights. Their contributions to the Enterprise challenge have also been remarkable.
- Community engagement was further enhanced with the OrbiRun initiative that promoted the values of service, fitness and social responsibility. The funds raised through OrbiRun were donated to Anjuman Islam School to purchase a PA system, thereby supporting educational infrastructure and fostering community development.

Collectively, these initiatives fostered empathy, social awareness and active citizenship among students while creating a tangible and positive impact on the community.

The school also focuses on physical well-being with initiatives like the Water Break. It encourages intellectual development through programs like DEAR hour, Students' Social Responsibility Projects, theme-based assemblies and Home visits by teachers.

There are various activities offered at the school, including Zoomer, Yardstick, Butterfly, School Cinema and Co-Curricular Clubs, which keep the campus lively and productive.

This year, 8 skill education clubs were introduced: Coding club, Embroidery club, Financial Literacy club, Herbal Heritage club, Travel & Tourism club, Making a Graphic Novel club, Mass Media club and Safety and Disaster management club, which helped students develop their skills.

The Orbis School in Keshav Nagar started the Happy Feet Football League for preschoolers in the 2025-26 academic year. This engaging initiative aims to introduce young children to the joys of football while promoting teamwork, physical fitness, and a love for sports from an early age.

The Orbis School, Keshav Nagar, is proud to be part of the EUMIND, or Europe Meets India programme, which connects our students with peers from European schools and promotes global understanding. In today's interconnected world, borders are becoming increasingly fluid, and ideas, cultures, and practices are blending in dynamic ways. It has thus become imperative to familiarise our students with global perspectives and provide them with exposure to diverse experiences.

For the academic year 2025-26, The Orbis School, Keshav Nagar, proudly joined the International Cultural Exchange Programme – EUMIND, partnering with Van De Perre School and Jac. P. Thijssen from the Netherlands. This collaboration allowed students to engage in a wide range of enriching activities, including:

- Research and data collation on the theme of Regions.
- Virtual video conferences with partner school students.
- Presentations and comparative analyses of findings between the two schools.

The programme offered students an experience of a lifetime. It was thrilling to witness them interact with their counterparts across continents, exploring and understanding different cultures, languages, and traditions. Beyond academic learning, this initiative enabled them to comprehend, contemplate, and celebrate diversity, fostering global awareness, intercultural sensitivity, and lifelong memories.

World Mental Health Day, observed on 10th October, was meaningfully commemorated by the school through a thoughtfully planned programme for students of Classes 9 to 12. The initiative aimed to promote mental well-being, build emotional resilience, and break prevailing stigmas around mental health. The event stood out for its student-led planning and execution, fostering ownership and leadership. The campus was transformed into a vibrant learning space with informative booths, interactive stalls, cultural presentations, and awareness sessions, making the celebration engaging, reflective, and impactful.

We are also a HUB school for the CBSE pilot programme on Mental Health.

During the academic year 2025-26, the school conducted a wide range of structured workshops for both students and teachers, aimed at holistic development and academic excellence. These included programmes on life skills, emotional and mental well-being, self-awareness, empathy, and mindfulness, along with sessions on personal safety, cyber security, healthy habits, and stress management. Academic enrichment workshops focusing on examination preparedness, study skills, answer-writing techniques, and presentation skills were also organised. In addition, career guidance and counselling sessions, including interactions with national and international universities, were conducted to support informed post-school choices, alongside professional development programmes on inclusive teaching practices for teachers.

The Indo Global University Fair brought together leading Indian and international universities, offering students valuable guidance on higher education opportunities, including courses, admissions, scholarships, and student life in India and abroad. With participation from reputed national and international institutions. The fair served as a comprehensive career-planning platform for students.

The Orbis School, Keshav Nagar, successfully conducted all the Olympiad exams such as IMO, IEO, NSO, IGKO, NCO and ISSO. Many of our students won accolades in various subjects and have secured International ranks.
