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## ANNUAL REPORT 2021-22

John Maxwell, an American author and motivational speaker, once said, 'Change is inevitable, only growth is optional'. It has amply been demonstrated that change is inevitable in every aspect of our lives and it is equally true that when we choose to grow, that growth can be the best phase of our lives.

Though it would be impossible to wrap up what we do at the school in such a short time, we will make an earnest effort to present to you a glimpse of how the year has unfolded. We begin with few of the many achievements of the year:

Our students of classes 10 and 12 have made us proud indeed. Through an unusual twist of fate, the results of the Board exams for class 10 as well as for class 12 were computed in school itself according to a unique formula developed by the CBSE to compensate for the fact that the examinations had to be cancelled in the wake of the second CORONA wave sweeping the country.

In class 10 our school topper was Sayee Deshmane with 97.4%. Coming in a close second was Harshita Priyadarshni with 97.2% and the third place was shared by Anahita Gambhir and Riya Kulkarni, both with 97%. Sayee and Harshita also share the honour of scoring a clean 100 in Hindi. 53 of our students scored above 90% while 28 were in the bracket of 80 to 90% and 11 students scored between 70 to 80%.

Our class 12 threw up the surprise result of our toppers in all the three streams achieving the exact same score. Nikita Nair and Prajakta Kadam share the first position in the Science stream, Sanyogita Sarin topped the Commerce stream and Kavana Anklekar was first in the Arts stream. All with 96%.

47 students scored above 90%, 82 students scored between 80 and 90% while 18 students scored between 70 and 80%.

It is a matter of pride that The Orbis School, Keshav Nagar, was a centre for the national level NEET Examination, a duty and responsibility that is entrusted to schools handpicked by the CBSE and for the first time, also a home centre for the 1st term Board examinations for classes 10 as well as for class 12.

With consistent effort and teamwork the School has been the recipient of a number of prestigious awards through the year.

We are proud to share that the School won awards for Innovation in curriculum and for Co-Scholastic activities by EduExcellence, was ranked by MHW as Best school for life skills, mental health & wellbeing, was awarded Outstanding School of the year by World Congress, received the ET Business award and continues with the International School Award by British Council for a period of a further two years.

On the occasion of Teacher's Day, Ms.Harpreet Kaur Gandhi was honoured with the prestigious Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam Memorial Teacher's award, 2021 and Ms Sonika Babbar, Coordinator Secondary section won the Global Teacher Award organised by AKS.

Forbes India featured the journey of The Orbis Schools -Rehashing the conventional education system to adapt to a new change' under the leadership of Mr. Haseeb Faquih, Founder Secretary, The Orbis Education Society.

We also saw the launch of the Orbis Brand Manual, Teachers Handbook and 'Orbitravectio', our Coffee Table Book, on Thursday, 14th October 2021. Mr Suresh Advani along with his wife, graced the occasion as Chief Guest.

There are no secrets to success, It is the result of sheer dedication and hard work. Our students continue to win laurels in sports, drama, music, poetry and much more.

Sushrut Bhutala of Class 3 participated in the Explore and



Explain Quiz, organised by the Sakal Media Group. He received the Science Wizard Award for an excellent performance. Kavana Anklekar of Class 12 participated in a Poetry Competition where her poem was selected by the internationally renowned Pulitzer Center and it will be published on its website. Annika Dhara of Class 3 participated in the 'Sakal Drawing Competition' organised by the Sakal Newspaper and secured the 1st Runners Up position. Bhoumik Gulechha also of Class 3 has created a record for 'Maximum miniature cartoon characters made by a child'. His record will feature in the India Book of Records for 2022. Some beautiful paintings by Swara Shah of Class 3 were exhibited at 'Manikarnika Art Gallery's Future Star Artist' . Meet Joshi of Class 4 has been recognized by the "Asia Book Of Records " and "India Book Of Records" for setting a new record in reciting the maximum number of mantras in one minute. Prishka Jain, a Sr.KG Orbian was chosen as the Anchor of the month in the Current Affairs Olympiad. Another notable achievement by one of our little ones from Pre Primary is that of Avani Patil, who secured first position in the Little Leap Olympiad. Vallabh Mahabal, also of Sr. KG, was the winner in a drawing competition organised by Sakal Times. Aadi Chendake and Naman Parmar again of Sr. KG stood first in the school and secured second International Rank in Logikids. Saanvi Vojjala of class 9 won first prize at K Talk, an Inter school Elocution competition hosted by Kalyani School.The Orbis School was first runner-up in the Treasure Hunt Game at 'Tirangaa' an Inter School competition organised by Amanora School. It is noteworthy to mention that our Interact club under the able leadership of Shrestha Sharma, is the very first Interact Club in the entire zone to come out with a monthly magazine that highlights all the activities that are conducted in the club and has won admiration for it.

We are proud of these talented young boys and girls who are keen to reach beyond the text book and script a recipe of success for themselves.

With a purpose to overcome adversities and to win, the role of sports remained very essential. Sports as always was an integral part of the curriculum at school, from UN Yoga day to FIT India Campaign, interactive HPE activities and Online sports competition and celebration of the Sports Day was all included to make sure to level up the fitness quotient of the children.

The School in collaboration with SPIC MACAY hosted a five day classical dance workshop for children. The workshop was conducted by renowned artist Ms. Prerana Shrimali on a virtual platform. The objective of this workshop was to facilitate the exchange of traditional Indian values and to generate awareness amongst the youth about the rich cultural traditions and heritage of India.

Virtual Field Trips transported our students to far away National parks, museums, volcanos, glaciers, dairy farms, chocolate factories,zoos and they even got to view the space. Dear HOUR was celebrated to inculcate the habit of reading, virtual PTMs which saw a near 100% attendance and proved invaluable in sharing feedback, Orbiloqui our annual literary event, Orbitheatrum our annual performing arts event, the Investiture ceremony for our incoming student Council, the solemn and meaningful Installation ceremony for our Interactors, our Founder's Day ceremony, numerous Inter house literary events, movie week special assemblies for all

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our National festivals and many more such calendar events were modified and innovatively carried out virtually. The school conducted a virtual Indo Global University Fair where many renowned National as well as International Universities participated and gave an insight on the study options and procedure to apply to both global as well as Indian universities. The School continues its association with its sister school in The Netherlands through EUMIND and our students enjoy their interactions with their counterparts while working on common projects.

If you are going to be a winner in life, you have to constantly go beyond your best. A full and complete calendar year would otherwise not have been possible seeing the challenges that were thrown at us.

At the Orbis School, nurturing young minds to look beyond themselves remains a very important task. Our teachers too benefited enormously with webinars, among others, like Theatre training in the context of the NEP, problem solving, Gratitude, computational thinking, how to tackle the problem of addiction in children, a training session by Microsoft, competency based education etc. The school also ran a sevenday wellness program for parents, students and teachers called 'Let there be Light' which was very well attended.

Coming to Safety at school, the year 2021 was challenging in many ways. Reopening physically for our senior classes as well as conducting the 1st Term Board examinations in the school premises called for a high level of vigilance and discipline. From creating SOPs to physical arrangements for the safety and security of the students and teachers, we have been extra careful to follow all precautions to the 'T'. The schools are fully compliant with the guidelines issued by the Government and have been certified safe by the PMC. The School Safety Committee, the Disaster Management Committee amongst others meet regularly to look into and devise better ways to create a safe campus as well as handle any unforeseen disaster effectively. Social distancing, wearing masks at all times and hand sanitisation has become second nature to all.

Round the year the management and the staff has worked individually and collectively to find solutions and create new learning environments for their students to allow education to continue.
