The online platform was never a hindrance to these endeavours.

A number of highly motivating and educational workshops and webinars run through the year by both external faculty as well as our own teachers, parents and even grandparents, To mention a few: Careers in Defence, a Webinar on Unconventional Career Choices, a Workshop on "Tips To Crack the National Talent Search Examination", Awareness About Online Gaming, the Veer Gatha Project by CBSE, workshops on Insights to the IT industry, Teamwork, value based sessions, mental wellness, fireless cooking, cyber bullying etc helped our students in many ways. Our teachers too benefited enormously with webinars, among others, like Theatre training in the context of the NEP, problem solving, Gratitude, computational thinking, how to tackle the problem of addiction in children, a training session by Microsoft, competency based education etc. The school also ran a seven-day wellness program for parents, students and teachers called 'Let there be Light' which was very well attended.

Coming to Safety at school, the year 2021 was challenging in many ways. Reopening physically for our senior classes called for a high level of vigilance and discipline. From creating SOPs to physical arrangements for the safety and security of the students and teachers, we have been extra careful to follow all precautions to the 'T'.
